
News From:

Homemade: Fall Peanut Butter Dog Treats

Making homemade snacks for your four-legged friend is a breeze with this simple peanut butter dog treats recipe. Pups will love the peanut butter flavor!

Author: Brittany Mullins Serves: 120 mini bones

Ingredients

- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- ½ cup creamy peanut butter
- ¼ cup unsweetened apple sauce or ¼ cup mashed banana
- ¼ cup vegetable, chicken or beef stock
- bone shaped cookie cutter



Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°.

Combine flour, peanut butter and apple sauce (or mashed banana) in a large mixing bowl. Add stock and stir until well-combined. The dough will be thick. Once combined use your hands to press the dough into a ball. Place dough ball on a flat service (with a sprinkle of flour if needed) and roll out evenly with a rolling pin. Dough should be about ¼ inch thick. Use a cookie cutter to cut the dough into desired shape and place on ungreased baking sheet.

Bake for 18 minutes or until golden brown. Store in an airtight container.
